

## Abortion Referrals for West Virginia Women

State resources aimed at referral-makers counseling patients and clients with an unintended pregnancy rarely contain information about where to refer women for abortion care. We hope the information below will supplement existing referral information you have for patients or clients with an unintended pregnancy. This list includes abortion providers who are members of the National Abortion Federation, the Abortion Care Network, Planned Parenthood affiliates, and clinics that are not members of any professional organizations of abortion providers.

### Abortion Care

**National Abortion Federation (NAF) Member Clinics:** NAF member clinics must undergo Quality Assurance and Improvement visits prior to membership and are subjected to further visits by NAF personnel on a regular basis, in addition to inspections by the state licensing agency. NAF members must also adhere to NAF's clinical standards, including their Ethical Principles for Abortion Care. For more information please visit: <http://prochoice.org/about-naf/>. Patients accessing abortion care at NAF clinics may be eligible for support through NAF.

**Abortion Care Network (ACN) Member Clinics:** The ACN is national membership organization for independent clinics whose values and philosophy are to provide patients with the highest standards of care. While ACN does not perform clinical inspections, they have rigorous standards for applicants to ensure they fit their core values of honesty, respect for patients and staff, and a commitment to quality care. **Planned Parenthood Affiliates (PPFA):** PPFA clinics are subjected to standards set forth by the organization itself to adhere to the highest quality abortion care based on evidence-based practices. Patients seeking abortions at Planned Parenthood affiliates may be eligible for funding through individual clinic resources. For more information please visit: <https://www.plannedparenthood.org/>. Patients accessing abortion care at PPFA affiliates may be eligible for support through local clinic funds.

**Unaffiliated Abortion Providers:** Clinics that are not members of NAF or ACN are required to comply with state licensing standards and must pass state licensing inspections. Financial assistance for patients seeking abortions at these clinics will be dependent upon the policies at the individual clinics.

*Referrals for Minors:* In West Virginia, a parent or guardian must be notified before a minor can access abortion services. The minor may seek a judicial bypass. Clinics can discuss this option with the patient. Minors can also contact West Virginia Free at (304) 342-9188 or [www.wvfree.org](http://www.wvfree.org).
